Section 4. First aid measures

4.1. Description of first aid measures

Section 5. Fire-fighting measures

5.1. Extinguishing media

5.3. Advice for fire-fighters

As with all fires, wear positive pressure, self-contained breathing apparatus, (SCBA) with a full face piece and protective clothing. Persons without respiratory protection should leave area. Wear SCBA during clean-up immediately after fire. No smoking.

Exercise caution when fighting any chemical fire. Use water spray or fog for cooling exposed containers. Do not enter fire area without proper protective equipment, including respiratory protection.
